
### This weeks Book Preview.

#### How the Bible speaks today.

'Psalm 23 is important to me because, about four years ago, we were living in London and my husband wanted to move. But we were part of a big church and the children were in a lovely school, so I didn't want to move. Something had to budge. 'We were part of a home group and they prayed for us. After that, I woke up in the night with the verses, "He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside still waters," in my mind. We came to look for a house and I had these words in my mind. 'The house is in green pastures and beside still waters, beside a lake. The words from Psalm 23 became real. That was so helpful. It was like the Lord was leading us there and had gone before us. So, I could trust that that was where we were meant to be. That made the move out of London OK. 'Now, I'm really thankful for the move, which I can't believe I'm saying. We look out of the house and see creation, sunrise and sunset. We see God all around. It's lovely. We can see green pastures all around us and, from our bedroom window, we can see the lake. It's so healing.

'I go back to Psalm 23 all the time, and I've got it in the kitchen, above the Aga. It's very real for me. I struggle to remember Bible verses, but no one can

take these verses away from me.'



## <u>Hymns and their stories</u> "What a Friend We Have in Jesus"

In 1844 a young Irishman, Joseph Scriven, had completed his college education and returned home to marry his sweetheart. As he was travelling to meet her on the day before the planned wedding, he came upon a horrible scene—his beautiful fiancée tragically lying under the water in a creek bed after falling off her horse.

Later, Scriven moved to Canada and eventually fell in love again, only to experience devastation once more when she became ill and died just weeks before their marriage. For the second time, this humble Christian felt the loss of the woman he loved.

The following year, he wrote a poem to his mother in Ireland that described the deep friendship with Jesus he had cultivated in prayer through the hardships of his life. The poem was published anonymously at first under the title, "Pray Without Ceasing." Ten years later, he finally acknowledged this well-loved text had been written by him and his friend, Jesus

In 1868, attorney Charles Converse set the text to a tune and renamed it "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." Ken Osbeck tells the story in his book <u>101 Hymn</u> <u>Stories</u>.

Instead of thinking God was punishing him, Scriven cherished God's friendship through all of this hardship—a friendship he discovered in prayer.

May we learn that our relationship for each of us with God will grow the same way—in prayer. During Dec we will be looking at Carols and their stories.

### **The persecuted Christians & Church**

A Nigerian Christian journalist has been arrested and imprisoned for reporting the attacks against Christians in Nigeria's Middle Belt.

The mother of a 12 yr old Christian girl in Punjab India has raised fears that she will be forced to marry her captor and convert to Islam. Through Barnabasfund Afghan Christians, both those who had gone to neighbouring countries, albeit Muslim dominated, and those still left in Afghanistan are very grateful for support from Christians around the world.
