My Bible-My Story



'When my wife and I got married a friend embroidered verses from Proverbs 3 for us as a gift. All these years later, it still hangs in our hallway. It reads, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

'When I look back now, I can see its relevance for my life. I was brought up in Alexandria in Egypt. I came here to take up a career in psychiatry, but what happened is nothing short of miraculous.

I had a visitors' visa for three months. There were two weeks of the visa period left. But I had burned my bridges at home. I was in a paralysis of depression and couldn't think what I was going to do.

A GP, a lovely man, asked me what was wrong. I told him. He had a friend who was a psychiatrist. Two days later the psychiatrist rang. I went to see him and he was happy to train me. I gave him my passport and went from having to leave the country in two weeks to being employed and staying. I worked from 1983 and retired in 2010.

'When I look back now I can see the hand of God in it.

It has been redemptive.
Every day I am reminded of this because I see the embroidery on our hall wall.'

News of the persecuted church

In Mozambique Islamists attacked a minibus and beheaded two Christian men. A statement released by IS Mozambique said 'By the grace of God Almighty, the soldiers of the Caliphate killed two Christians, beheading them, and shooting them with weapons' Islamists gained control of Cabo Delgado in 2017 and the province has been dubbed 'The land of fear' owing to brutal violence against both Christians and moderate Muslims. In 2021 forces began to drive the Islamist insurgency back, but it appears to be spreading once again. In Iran five Iranian Christians lost their appeal against sentencing for involvement in 'House Churches'. They had jail sentences and fines imposed against them. In India, Christians are challeng-

ing the anti-conversion law in Karnataka.
